Welcome! Explore and Grow Learning Center is committed to excellence in early childhood education. We strive to provide a warm and nurturing environment that supports children as they learn and grow socially, emotionally, intellectually, and physically. Our staff provides unique experiences designed with each child’s needs in mind. By encouraging participation in group activities, we teach our children how to get along with each other and assist in developing a sense of security and belonging. We strive to instill in each child.

We believe that life is a learning experience, and it is our mission to bring a higher degree of compassion and dedication to your child’s education. We offer a year-round age-specific curriculum developed to grow with your child and help prepare him/her for a lifetime of learning and success. Our curriculum is based on a Learn-through-Play philosophy and is filled with challenging yet developmentally appropriate activities. Children are encouraged to participate according to their needs, strengths, and interests. We work hard to provide a wide variety of enriching activities designed to keep learning fun.

Our program’s goal is to provide both children and families with an environment which lets each child’s uniqueness shine. There are many opportunities throughout the year planned to get the entire family involved in the Explore and Grow Learning Center experience. We love each of our families as our own and look forward to making your family a part of our ever-growing community.

Explore and Grow Learning Center Curriculum Overview

Teachers - Our teachers are highly trained and professional. Each member of staff has had a background check and fingerprinting completed before being hired. All staff are both CPR and First Aide Certified. They are also trained and have extensive knowledge of early childhood and specific training in developmentally appropriate practices related to the age of the children they care for. All staff recognize and respect the uniqueness and potential of each child, their families and their culture. Ongoing training and monitoring ensure our teachers have training surpassing that which is required by Texas law. We don't require for employees to be Vaccines reference to minimum standard #502.

Curriculum Goal – The goal of our early learning curriculum is to provide a safe, nurturing, and engaging environment that promotes each child's growth across all developmental domains through meaningful, play-based learning experiences. The curriculum is aligned with the **Texas Infant, Toddler, and Three-Year-Old Early Learning Guidelines**, the **Texas Prekindergarten Guidelines** (as appropriate), and supports school readiness by fostering language, literacy, math, science, social-emotional development, physical development, and creative expression. Through responsive teaching, family partnerships, and ongoing observation and assessment, we strive to meet the individual needs of every child while encouraging curiosity, independence, and a lifelong love of learning.

Infants (6 weeks to 17 Months) - The curriculum designed towards our littlest explorers includes sensory activities as well as activities (designed to promote language and social development). We plan activities to engage creativity, strengthen motor skills, and build those first connections in the brain. We are currently using Circle Curriculum provided through CLI Engage.

Toddlers (18 - 35 Months) - We use a literature-based curriculum for our toddler room. Each week's lessons are themed around a piece of children's literature. Integrated into each theme are Alphabet and Number activities as well as shape, colors, and early concepts such as opposites and sorting. Toddlers are always on the go, and we use this energy to plan activities that build both fine and gross motor skills. We also encourage social and

emotional growth by talking about feelings and sharing during daily circle and free play centers time. We are currently using Circle Curriculum provided through CLI Engage.

Pre School (3-4 years) - Our Pre School-Curriculum is designed to create a passion for learning. Our hands on approach to learning basic concepts like phonics, printing, early math, and science makes for fun filled days. We strive to nurture natural curiosity and build independence for our Preschoolers while teaching boundaries and social skills. We combine Scholastic Big Day PreK with some activities to supplement from the Circle Curriculum on CLI Engage.

Pre-Kindergarten - Our Pre K curriculum is using Scholastic's Big Day PreK Curriculum. Each week's lessons surround a common theme. During each week our subjects include Writing, Reading, Math, Science, Social Studies, Art, Music and Movement. as well as weekly bible study. We integrate individual, small group and large group times throughout each day's activities. A detailed description of the pre-kindergarten curriculum is available. Feel free to ask the Director or Class teacher. The curriculum is implemented in the classroom by the teachers.

School Aged Program - Our after-school program includes homework help and a healthy snack. We also have free time and outdoor play to let out some of the energy stored up during the school day. We also offer Spring Break, Christmas and Summer Camps. The camps include field trips, arts and crafts and many other fun activities

Parent Feedback- parents are given an annual survey to assess our curriculum, facilities, staff performance and overall satisfaction.

Parent Teacher Conferences - Parent and teacher conferences will be scheduled Twice a year to keep you informed of your child's progress. Teachers will use a developmental milestone checklist, which will be shared with parents. If any developmental delays are identified, parents will be provided with the appropriate referrals.

If you need additional time to discuss your child's progress, please let us know. Parents are welcome to observe their child at any time; however, for security purposes, all visitors to the playground or classroom areas must first be cleared by the front office. Please do not use drop off/pick up time to communicate lengthy concerns with your child's teacher, as this can distract the care of other children in the classroom.

Parent/Staff Communication – The Bright wheel app is used by both staff and parents to communicate daily. Parents can update personal information, notify staff of pick-up and drop-off arrangements, and make payments through the app. Our goal is to keep communication doors open between the family and the center. Each parent will receive a monthly newsletter sent to you through the app that provides important information and upcoming events at the center.

We strive to keep communication between families and the center open and transparent. Weekly and/or daily reports will be sent through paper copy or through the bright wheel app to update you on your child's daily experiences and daily progress.

Once a year, a survey will be sent to current parents. Any concerns or suggestions will be reviewed and addressed and implemented when necessary.

Parent Involvement- Explore and Grow Learning Center will celebrate the following events with parent participation: Mother's Day, Father's Day, and Oktoberfest. Parents are also welcome to visit the classroom to read books to the children; however, visits must be scheduled in advance.

Tuition: Tuition is billed weekly through Bright wheel and is due on the first day of each week. All payments must be made through Bright wheel. Any unpaid tuition after Thursday evening of the current week will be considered delinquent, and a late fee of \$15 per day will be assessed until the balance is paid in full.

Registration fees and tuition are non-refundable in the event of illness absence or if a child is withdrawn. A detailed description of all tuition and fees will be provided in your enrollment packet.

Physical Activities

Our daily schedule provides opportunities for children to engage in physical activities. We have age-appropriate outdoor and indoor activities as part of their daily schedule. All age groups, excluding infants, will receive a minimum of 45 minutes each day engaged in outdoor play. The children play outside freely using playground equipment and outside toys like the playhouse, balls, tricycles and much more. During inclement weather we do indoor activities to promote physical development.

Screening time - electronic media is only used for educational purposes only or for watching a designated movie that's under one hour a day and is free from advertisement and free from any violence being shown. Screen time is not used during mealtimes whatsoever. School- aged children who need the technology to complete their homework will be provided with technology without restriction for the use of homework. Screen time for children under the age of 2 is prohibited!

Transition Plans- when your child is ready to move into a new classroom, we do what we can to make this transition a smooth and successful one. We will let you know in advance when your child is ready to move up. The move will always be a decision among parents, teachers, and administrative staff. We understand that transitions can be challenging, so we will be in consideration of each child's temperament and adjust transitions accordingly.

Withdrawal Policy - Parents must notify Explore and Grow Learning Center in writing two weeks prior to withdrawing their child. Tuition will be charged if notice is not given.

Overtime - Our school closes promptly at 6:30pm, **after 6:30pm a late pick-up charge will be assessed.** The charge is \$5.00 per child for the first 5 minutes and \$2.00 per minute/per child thereafter

Absences – If your child is going to be absent, please call before 9 am or send a message through the app. You must contact us by noon, so the bus driver is aware before making the afternoon pick-up from the school. Tuition will not be refunded in case of illness or absence. Children that are absent for more than one week without notification are withdrawn from the program. 1 absence is allowed per month for a year.

Holiday Schedule - Explore and Grow Learning Center will be closed for the following holidays:

New Year's Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day (July 4th) Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Black Friday, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and New Year's Eve.

If a holiday falls on the weekend, we will be closed to observance either the day before or after depending on when the local business is observing the day.

If, for any reason, this holiday policy should change you will be notified well in advance.

Note: Tuition is due IN FULL for the week in which a holiday is observed.

Vacations - If you remove your child for any reason for an extended period of time (three weeks or more), you must continue to make school tuition payments if you want your child's space to be guaranteed. Tuition will continue to be charged until a change of schedule form is completed, notifying us of an extended absence. If an extended absence is taken, and tuition is not paid, the child's space in the classroom will be forfeited. If you wish to re-enroll, and the child's space is still available, a \$100 reinstatement fee must be paid before the child will be re-enrolled. This non-refundable

fee is in addition to the usual tuition charges. 50% of the tuition will be charged for the week of vacation after the completion of a whole year.

Procedure for Pick Up and Drop Off Policy - Upon arrival the child must be brought in through the front office to a staff member who will sign them in on our sign-in/out sheet and check them in on the bright wheel app. CHILDREN SHOULD NOT BE LEFT UNATTENDED AT ANY TIME! Your child's safety is our number one priority, please consider this additional time in your morning routine as we work together to ensure the safety and well-being of your child. Once its pick-up time the parent and/or guardian is allowed to come in the building and get their child from the classroom and a staff member will sign them out on the sign in/out sheet and check out from the bright wheel app as well.

If your child is picked up by anyone not listed on the enrollment form, you must notify the front desk in advance. Notification may be provided in writing, through Bright wheel, or by calling the Learning Center. A valid photo ID will be required before your child is released. Unless it is an emergency, please finish all phone calls before entering the building during drop-off and pick-up times.

Always keep your children with you and do not allow them to roam the building or walk out of it alone.

Update contact information – if a parent needs to update contact or pick up information without help from a staff member they are more than welcome to update it through the bright wheel app and let staff know by sending a message for the staff to be notified.

Meals – Explore and Grown Learning Center serves nutritious meals approved by the US Department of Agriculture's food program (CACFP). Students and parents are educated on proper nutrition throughout the year. Our menus and food program follow the guidelines under the state requirements.

We serve Breakfast 6:30am - 8:30 am Lunch 11:30 - 12:30 pm Snack 2:30 – 3:30 pm Super at 4:30PM – 5:30pm

We do not charge an extra fee for meals and snacks.

We provide meals for infants such as baby food and cereal as a participant of the USDA Federal Food Program. If your child requires a special diet due to **allergies**, a written Physician's statement MUST be on file at the center with specific instructions and parents must provide the meals.

On special occasions such as birthdays and holidays, only packaged food is allowed. Our center is a peanut-free zone!

Liquids and food hotter than 110 degrees F are kept away from children's reach.

Staff are educated about food allergies, and they take precautions to ensure children's safety.

Parents are encouraged to provide meals with nutritional value for their child when preparing home lunches. Healthy lunch examples may include meat, cheese, fruit, vegetables and yogurt. Home lunches brought to the center must be labeled and put in an insulated lunch container.

Prepared food brought to school for sharing with children must be store bought.

Healthy snacks are available when school-age children arrive.

You can find the monthly lunch menu on the bulletin board in the lunchroom or in the hallway by the kitchen door.

Farm to early care – healthy eating habits during your Child's early years is important to create healthy eating practices into adulthood. For more information on the benefits of eating healthy and fresh, use the site <https://squaremeals.org/FandN-Resources/Texas-Farm-Fresh/Garden-based-Learning>

Staff does not reward good behavior or clean plate with foods of any kind. Milk, fruits and vegetables are available to all children at mealtimes.

Dress Code - Children MUST wear closed-toed shoes and socks DAILY. Open-toed shoes are not playground safe and will not be permitted.

Little girls like to jump, run and play so please make sure your child is wearing shorts or underwear under their dresses. Please provide children with an appropriate jacket/coat for outside time during colder months.

Explore and Grow T Shirts MUST be worn on all field trips and outings.

What does your child need in his/her cubby?

Each child should always have in his/her cubby the following items.

1- Complete change of clothes

2- Blanket and sheet (must be picked up every Friday to clean)

3- Sleep Buddy or Small Pillow (optional)

If your child is not fully potty trained, please make sure your child has diapers and wipes

Electronics Policy - Electronic devices are not permitted in the classrooms at any time. This includes but is not limited to cell phones, tablets, iPods and electronic gaming devices. Explore and Grow Learning Center and staff are not responsible for lost, broken or stolen electronics.

Accidents/Critical illness - First Aid will be administered for all minor injuries. Parents will be notified when necessary for care. We try our very best to prevent accidents for all of our children. All our staff are trained in CPR and First Aid and keep current certification. In the event of a major emergency, parents will be notified immediately, and emergency services will be contacted. CPR will be given when needed. Children must be free of symptoms for 24hrs before returning to school or a health-care professional has diagnosed as not contagious. If the child displays symptoms in the afternoon or evening, he/she should not be in school the next day. The child may not return to school with medication to control the symptoms (for example Tylenol for fever) unless it cleared with the director.

An ill child will be excluded from attendance for any of the following reasons: if their temperature is 100 degrees or more and it's accompanied by behavior changes or other symptoms. Signs of severe illness as in lethargy, uncontrolled breathing, uncontrolled diarrhea, vomiting, illness, rash or fever, mouth sores with drooling, wheezing, etc. the child is too sick to go outdoors is considered too sick to be at the center. There will be no exceptions.

Children who become ill at school will be excluded from the other children and parents will be called immediately. Please pick up your child as quickly as possible; if a classmate has contracted a contagious disease, we will notify parents immediately. If your child is ill and cannot come to school, please call and let us know.

Medication - Explore and Grow Learning Center will NOT dispense ANY medication without physician's written instructions. All medications MUST be signed in at the front office or Classroom and labeled with child's first and last name and have attached physician's instructions.

Immunizations- all children admitted to the facility must meet the immunization requirements, specified for the Child's age by the state's department of health. A copy of the most recent shot record must be provided for each child at enrollment and kept up to date. The parent is responsible for providing the center with the most up to date immunization requirements. Immunizations should be up to date before school begins and kept up to date annually. If for some reason they are not current, we are required to have a written statement from a physician stating that immunizations have begun and will be completed as soon as medically feasible.

Vision and Hearing Screening must be conducted and included in your child's file within 180 days of the child's 4th birthday.

Health Requirements - The State of Texas requires a signed statement from a Physician stating that the child is in good health and is able to take an active part in Explore and Grow Learning Center program. This is included in each child's file.

Emergency Preparedness Plan

An emergency/disaster plan has been developed to provide safety care for our children should an emergency or disaster occur during the program day. A copy of this plan is available for review at any time.

Staff Training - Along with ongoing curriculum and child development training exceeding the state minimum, every staff member of Explore and Grow Learning Center has been trained in preventing and responding to the abuse and neglect of children. This training includes spotting warning signs, prevention techniques and proper reporting of suspected abuse and neglect, as well as support for victims and families.

Breast Feeding - If you choose to breast-feed your child, a clean quiet place will be provided for you to do so. Also, if you choose to provide breast milk for your child, we ask that the milk be labeled with the child's name, dated, and in an insulated bag. We will be happy to store it and serve it for you. Breastfeeding education and support resources are available upon request. For more information about breastfeeding resources and maternal and child health in Texas, please contact infanthealth@dshs.texas.gov.

Accommodation- our program's policy and process in supporting families and children who may need additional accommodations to include home language, differing abilities and cultural backgrounds. Parents have the right to be informed of all

procedural safeguards and right of appeal in a language easily understood by the public and in the parents' primary language. Please notify the director if you or your child require accommodation and we will make sure that we do our part to meet your needs.

Referrals - We provide referrals for children with special needs as needed in the CFISD area.

Below are ways that program will partner with families:

- We'll provide space to accommodate sessions if specific therapies are needed during the while the child is in our care.
- Participation in all comprehensive care meetings if needed
- Complete support documentation from an authorized medical professional for any accommodations related to Childs physical or developmental needs
- Supply materials and resources in parents/Childs primary language
- Present opportunities for cultural inclusiveness by hosting cultural events throughout the year

Oral Health Policies- having good oral health early is very important for children's well-being. As a childcare center, we help the children and parents understand the importance of good Oral health. Additional resources on child oral health can be found by contacting: dental@dshs.texas.gov.

Transportation Policy – Explore and Grow Learning Center transportation is provided by the Explore and Grow Learning Center van / bus to and from the Center. If your child is scheduled to be picked up Explore and Grow Learning Center van from public school and does not need transportation for any given day a parent must notify the Center before 2pm. If the parent does not call the center there is a 5-dollar fee.

At pick up time from school the van driver will not wait for any child longer than 5 minutes.

Water Activity - We do splash day during the summertime; we use splashing pools and/or sprinkler play; parents will be notified before the activity.

Summer Camp - We will have adventures and field trips that are carefully planned for ages 6 -12 years old. Parents' permission is required.

Field Trip- for ages 6 and up are planned throughout the year. An announcement will be posted outside the Childs classroom door 48 hours before the field trip. A permission form will say the day, time, location and items your child will need for the day. The teacher will send a detailed list home before the trip.

Civil Rights - In accordance with Federal Law, Explore and Grow Learning Center does not discriminate against children, parents or coworkers for any reason. This is based on race, color, Nationality, sex, age, religion, or disability. All are welcome at our center.

Gang Free Zone - Explore and Grow Learning Center is a Gang Free Zone! Gang related criminal activity or engaging in organized criminal activity within 1000 feet of our center is prohibited and is subject to increased penalty under Texas law. As a result of House Bill 2086 that passed the 81st Legislature, Regular Session, Chapter 42 of the Human Resource Code will be amended to include Section 42.064 requiring that information about gang-free zones be distributed to parents and guardians of children in care at licensed childcare centers.

Explore and Grow Learning Center prohibits smoking on our property.

Parent/Family participation – involvement in our program is important to the success of your child. There are several ways that families can get involved with the center and activities to ensure that your experience while enrolled in our center will be a great one! Parents, you are encouraged to attend as many events as your schedule allows. Opportunities for parent.

involvement include Class parties, Monthly parent meetings, Holidays (see monthly calendar), graduation and so much more!

If you have questions or concerns about these policies, or any other issues please feel free to contact the director. If you would like to make an appointment, the director is available Monday through Friday. Parents will be notified of any policy changes immediately in writing.

Emergency Preparedness Plan - In the event of an emergency, Explore and Grow Learning Center has outlined the below response plan. Please know that we will make every attempt to notify you, so it is vital that you keep your emergency contact information up to date. Keep this letter in a safe place so that you will know how to contact us in the event of an emergency.

Evacuation/ Relocation - If the emergency is confined to the immediate area at Explore and Grow Learning Center, e.g. Fire, gas leak, flooding inside the building and the children cannot stay on the premises, the children will be taken to

Hurricane or Emergency Closing: - In the event of a Hurricane, Freezes or Flooding, Explore and Grow Learning Center will follow CY-FAIR ISD Emergency Closure Schedule. Parents will be notified of the closure.

Notification:

Every effort will be made to contact you as soon as the children and staff are safe. If we cannot reach you, we will contact your alternate emergency contact. Children will only be released to you or your alternate emergency contact during times of emergency.

Please rest assured that Explore and Grow Learning Center staff will always remain with and care for the children during an emergency to ensure the children's safety. As always, please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions or concerns.

Termination of Services- we reserve the right to terminate a child for the following reasons but not limited to:

- Failure to pay (see tuition)
- Consistently late picking up child(ren)
- Physical or verbal abuse of any person on the property
- Lack of compliance with regulations

- Failure of the child to adjust to the center after a reasonable amount of time

Disciplinary Procedures & Policies

Proverbs 10:17 tells us "He who heeds discipline shows the way to life, but whoever ignores correction leads others astray."

It is our desire for explore and Grow Learning Center students to be salt and light in the world, showing the way to live and not lead others astray!

Matthew 5:16 In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven.

Discipline Procedures & Policy

A very important part of Explore and Grow Learning Center experience is helping children learn how to get along in the world, enjoy being with other children, and follow the direction of an adult other than a parent. A caring and positive approach will be taken regarding behavior management and discipline. The teachers will focus on the positive behaviors of the children and reinforce those behaviors as often as possible. Our goal is to help the children develop self-control and responsibility for their actions.

Our discipline procedures will consist of the following strategies:

1. Encouraging children to use their words when having a disagreement with another child. Facilitating children in their attempts to settle their own disputes.
2. Redirecting behavior when this seems potentially effective.
3. Separating a child from the group (Time-Out) — one minute away for each year of age.
4. Counseling the children individually about their behaviors.
5. Making parents aware of disciplinary concerns (Incident Report)

Disruptive Behavior distracts from the full benefit of Explore and Grow Learning Center program and will result in consequences. The following behaviors are considered disruptive and will not be tolerated.

- * Requires constant attention from staff.

- * Inflicts physical or emotional harm on other children, adults, or self.
- * Disrespects people and materials provided in the program.
- * Consistently disobeys the rules of the classroom.
- * Verbally threatens other students and/or staff.

Uses verbal or physical activity that diverts attention away from the group of Children.

- * Use of foul, offensive OR hurtful language.

Discipline Procedures for disruptive behavior.

- * Disruptive Behavior will be addressed in an incident report. This will be completed to document any inappropriate behaviors that directly impact other children, staff members, or group as a whole. This report will be shared with the parents and will explain the behavior and how the behavior has affected others. It will also explain how the situation was resolved. The Parent will sign the incident report.
- * If a child has difficulty managing his/her behavior on a recurring basis, Parents will be asked to meet with the child's teacher and the Director to discuss the behavior and strategies to address the behavior.
- * If the child's behavior continues to be inappropriate, consistently disruptive, and/or dangerous, it may be necessary for the child to be sent home for a time to be determined or removed from Explore and Grow Learning Center altogether.

Children cannot become self-disciplined unless adults teach them right from wrong. At Explore and Grow Learning Center, children will be taught the expectations for correct behavior and encouraged to live and act accordingly. When children know something is wrong, and choose to do it anyway, consequences will follow to communicate that the behavior is not acceptable and will not be tolerated in our center. This is in line with God's relationship to us. He has given us His Word so that we may know how to live, and He has promised to discipline us if we belong to Him. Proverbs 3:11-12 "My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline and do not resent his rebuke, because the Lord disciplines those he loves, as a father the son he delights

Challenging behaviors- Our program is committed to addressing challenging behaviors in a supportive and productive manner and validating a positive learning environment for all children in our center. The goals we set for our program are to develop each

Childs social-emotional development, set positive interactions, and ensure school readiness with a safe and supportive environment.

We aim to help every child thrive and reach their full potential by using strategies to individual needs and encouraging family involvement. Teachers and the director communicate regularly with families about the Childs behavior to ensure a strong partnership. This allows us to address any concerns that arise. Teachers are to observe and document behaviors, using feedback and developing individual strategies to support each child. Parents and families are informed in their child's progress through the Bright wheel app or during a meeting with the parents.

Discussion regarding a Childs behavior will be talked about within our facilities objectives, which prioritizes positive interactions, school readiness, and safe learning environment. Our approach focuses on understanding the underlying causes of behaviors and aligning our strategies with our program goals.

Steps taken by the program:

- Observing and documentation- our teachers will regularly observe and document children's behavior to identify patterns and triggers
- Individual strategies- based on observation, the teacher use strategies in working together with the families to address specific behaviors.
- Daily communication- ongoing updates will be shared with families through communication logs, progress reports and scheduled conferences celebrating milestones and discussing areas for improvement and growth.
